PRINCIPAL’S PERSPECTIVE

Hello Wolfpack Community and welcome to the 2017-2018 school year!

With classes beginning on August 10, you will find some helpful information in this newsletter that will keep you connected to the Wolfpack.

Cosumnes Oaks High School continues to grow in size and in opportunity. We have been very strategic in the direction of our growth with the end goal of graduating students who are college, career, and life ready. Our academies and pathways have expanded to include Coding and Robotics; the Business Pathway will offer its Level 1 class this year; the Medical Careers Pathway is building its infrastructure and will be ready to launch in 2018-2019; and the AP Capstone Pathway is also approved for launch in 2018-2019. CTEIG (Career Technical Education Incentive Grant) has provided an opportunity for COHS to upgrade and modernize the following pathways: Robotics and Coding, Video Production, Broadcast Journalism, and Graphic Arts. Modernization is occurring throughout the summer.


In March 2017, COHS was awarded the California Department of Education’s Gold Ribbon Award for the freshman transition program, *Get Focused, Stay Focused* (GFSF). In May, State Superintendent Tom Torlakson recognized COHS for its efforts. The success of the GFSF program will continue to guide our implementation of the program for all 9th grade students and we will now begin to embed the tenets of the program in all grade level Advocacy classes. Parents of incoming 9th grade students will have an opportunity to hear about GFSF at the Freshman Parent Orientation on August 4. An application is in the works for this course to offer transferrable college credits for the 9th grade course and additional college credits for the Advocacy modules.

COHS will continue to expand its outreach to our parents and community members. Last year, a survey of parents indicated a strong interest in these three areas: Scholarship, Student Wellness/Recognizing the Signs of Suicide, and Navigating Social Media with their student. Due to the success of the COHS Parent/Guardian Series, we will be offering these sessions and more. Watch for surveys!

Communication—EGUSD will be transitioning to a new Student Information System called Synergy. As a result, School Loop will have been deactivated by the time you receive this newsletter. Synergy will have ParentVUE and StudentVUE features. Information about how to sign up and access new features will be forthcoming in the first weeks of school. In this newsletter, we have included the names and email addresses of key contacts for quick reference as we navigate this transition together.

As a final note, thank you for your partnership as we work together to create a unique and successful experience for students. We are the Wolfpack—as with any family dynamic, its success is grounded in the commitment and perseverance of every member: staff, students, parents/guardians, and school community. Have a great rest of your summer and get ready...the 2017-2018 school year is almost here!

CAMPUS VISITS

All visitors are required to check in at the Administration Office to receive a visitor's badge prior to entering campus. Visits to classrooms require a 24-hour advance arrangement with the teacher. Teachers may be contacted via email or voicemail. A directory of all personnel is available on our website, and also by calling our main line, (916) 683-7670.

The front office is not able to accept any items to be delivered to students. This includes books, lunches, money, sports equipment, flowers, balloons, clothing, etc. Please make these arrangements prior to or after school.

SYNERGY/PARENTVUE INFORMATION

Elk Grove Unified School District is implementing a very exciting platform for all student information and communication. The system includes two features specifically for our students and their families: ParentVUE and StudentVUE. The program will provide all of the same features you loved about Schoolloop and then some. You will have easy access to grades, class resources, and the ability to communicate with teachers and school staff with web and mobile access. And that's just the beginning. Please be on the lookout for more information in the fall as we transition to this cutting-edge system.

ATTENDANCE

Student Drop Off/Pick Up

For your child's safety, please do not drop students off at school prior to 7:30 a.m. Students should exit campus no later than 3:30 p.m. each day unless they have a pre-arranged meeting or activity.

Absences

Please call the main office each day your student is absent. A student's absence must be cleared within (5) school days or the absence is considered a truancy. Please refer to the COHS Student Handbook for more details regarding attendance and what is considered excused and unexcused per the state of California's Education Code.

Early Dismissals

Parents are asked to call the main office well in advance of an early dismissal from school. Early dismissals may not be arranged after 2:30 p.m. In addition, students are only dismissed to individuals listed on the student's record.

Late Arrivals

Students who arrive more than ten minutes late to school are required to check in at the attendance windows in the main office.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION FORM

In the opening day packet, all students will receive a Student Emergency Information Update form that must be completed by the parent/guardian and returned the first week of school. This information is vital to the safety and well-being of your child. Please provide phone numbers for individuals listed as emergency contacts; if numbers change, please update the information as soon as possible. In addition, if your student's contact information, address, or guardianship status has changed, please stop by the school in August to ensure that your student's contact information is correct. Thank you for working with us as we work to maintain a safe and healthy learning environment.

EGUSD SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

Parents/ guardians are encouraged to use the secure www.MySchoolBucks.com website that allows families to register and deposit money in a student's lunch account; parents/guardians can track purchases on a daily basis. The meal prices are as follows: Breakfast—\$2.00 / Lunch—\$3.25. Students may also pay with cash in the cafeteria.

In addition, free and reduced price meals are available under the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), to all families who believe they may qualify. Families who wish to apply for the school Lunch Program must fill out a new application for the 2017-2018 school year within the first month of school. Applications will be sent home with students in the first day packet.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

ANY medication (prescription or over-the-counter) at school, requires a Medication Assistance Authorization. The Medication Assistance Authorization form is located on the school website and can also be picked up in the Student Services building. Please complete the form, sign where indicated, have your child's physician sign where indicated, and return this form to the Health Office located in the Student Services building. All medication must be provided to the school by a parent/legal guardian. The school will store the medication and dispense it in compliance with the medication directive. All medication supplied to the school must be in its original labeled form (i.e., in the original prescription bottle, sealed package, etc.) as received from the physician, pharmacy or store. Except for personal asthma inhalers and personal Epipens, a student may not independently possess medication during the school day or while on school property. There are no exceptions to this requirement due to health and safety concerns, due to the potential theft of the medication, or the potential sharing/use of the medication. This could result in an unexpected allergic or other negative reaction. Students found in possession of medication, or providing medication to another student, will face disciplinary action.

COHS PARENT/GUARDIAN SERIES

Last year we piloted our “Parent University” series. We received a great amount of positive feedback from parents, students, and teachers alike as we addressed the topics of teen suicide, AP classes, and the addictive effects of electronic devices. We look forward to continuing these events under the title “COHS Parent/Guardian Series”. COHS SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL

The School Site Council is a group of teachers, parents, classified employees, and students that works with the principal to develop, review and evaluate school improvement programs and school budgets. The members make decisions and approvals on the school budget and the academic goals it supports.

TIPS FROM OUR COUNSELORS

Freshmen

Start planning now! Ninth grade classes do matter if you plan to attend community college, a 4-year university, join the military, or attend a trade school. You must earn a C or better in all your A-G courses to get into a 4-year college or university. Do your best the first time. Learn to use Synergy's StudentVUE and check it daily. Check your grades and stay on top of all classwork and homework.

Sophomores

Review your freshman year. How did you do? Did you earn a C or better in your courses? Check with your counselor. Are you taking the courses you need to apply to college? Stay on top of your classes and know where you stand at all times.

PSAT testing will be administered on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 on a reverse minimum day. EGUSD will provide this test for free for our 10th graders. Take the PSAT! (National Merit Scholars are chosen from 11th grade scores, not scores taken in 10th grade.)

Juniors

Review your high school coursework and activity plans.

Keep in mind what colleges and other post-secondary programs are looking for:

- Are you taking challenging coursework? (A-G)
- Do you have a strong GPA (grade point average)?
- Are you involved in extracurricular activities such as sports, volunteer work, leadership, or other civic organizations?
- Do you have a Social Security number? You will need it to apply to colleges/universities and for financial aid.

Juniors! Save the date! PSAT testing will be administered on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 on a reverse minimum day. If you are an 11th grade student going straight to a four year college this is the only test you must take to determine if you will qualify as a National Merit Scholar. Take the PSAT – National Merit Scholars are chosen from 11th grade scores.

College-Bound Athletes

If you are planning to play any sport at a Division I or II College, you must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at the end of your junior year. The Clearinghouse evaluates your academic record to determine if you are eligible to participate at a Division I or II college as a freshman student-athlete. To register, go online to www.eligibilitycenter.org. Select "Create an Account." Pay the \$80 registration fee (fee waivers based on financial need are available in the Career Center). Request an Official Transcript be sent to NCAA. Transcript request forms are available on the COHS website and through the Student Store. Return the completed request form and \$2 official transcript fee to the Student Store.

Seniors

Pass those classes the first time! There may not be a second chance. All your classes count for college; remember they can revoke your acceptance so be sure to stay on top of those grades. Apply to colleges and universities on time. Stay on top of your post-secondary plan; don't rely on anyone but yourself!

Listen to the bulletin, Wolfpack TV, and website news—all information for college and university visits, financial aid, scholarships, military and much more will be posted on the website.

If you don't know, see your counselor. Don't be left behind!

WOLFPACK DISTINCTIONS

A number of programs on campus lead to special recognition during the graduation ceremony. COHS has several Academy/Pathway programs: Culinary Arts, Architectural Design and Engineering, Robotics and Coding, Video Broadcasting, and Graphic Design.

Academy and Pathway students must complete the required courses for each program; the final course includes a Capstone project which reflects the industry standards for that particular Academy or Pathway.

In addition, Cosumnes Oaks High School offers two specialized programs: Visual and Performing Arts and the Advanced Placement (AP) Diploma Program. Students are required to complete at least five (5) courses linked to those programs in order to receive special recognition.

The elite ALPHA Award recipients are nominated by staff. This award recognizes seniors who best exemplify the core values of COHS: prepared scholars, accomplished communicators, lifelong learners, and knowledgeable, global citizens. Additional acknowledgements are presented to AVID, Future Business Leaders of America, California Scholarship Federation, Leadership, Link Crew, and National Honor Society students who complete their respective programs.

REQUESTING TRANSCRIPTS

Transcript request forms are available on the COHS website and at the Student Store. The request must be signed by a parent/guardian for students under the age of 18. Once signed, the completed form is submitted to the Student Store. *Unofficial* transcripts for current students are no charge. Official transcripts are \$2 each and payment is made when turning in the request at the Student Store. Please allow 48 hours for processing. Final transcripts for graduating seniors are available mid-June.

TRANSCRIPTS FOR ATHLETES

Athletes and their parents must complete the Unofficial Transcript Release form (available from the Registrar) in order for COHS to release transcripts to representatives of colleges for athletic purposes. COHS must have the signed release form on file in order to respond to requests from recruiters.

EGUSD COLLEGE AND CAREER WEBSITE

The College section contains a wealth of resources, including information on colleges in California and throughout the country, as well as 360 degree virtual tours of campuses and information on how to apply, prepare, and pay for college.

The Career section provides students and parents the ability to create resumes and complete job applications live. This section also includes a link to a national job bank which will allow students the opportunity to conduct a live job search.

SAT AND ACT 2017-2018 (COHS CODE: 054204)

College admission applications require an SAT/ACT test score. Most colleges and universities will not process an application without one. The two national tests are the SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test) and the ACT (American College Test). Almost all four-year colleges and universities in the nation accept either the SAT or ACT scores equally. Because research indicates that many students perform quite differently on the SAT and the ACT, it may benefit students to take both tests since colleges typically use the higher of the two scores for admission, scholarship, and athletic eligibility. It is recommended that students take the SAT and/or ACT in the spring of their junior year and again in the fall of their senior year.

Scholastic Assessment Test (SAT)

The SAT is a test that measures critical reading, mathematical reasoning and writing skills related to successful performance in college. The SAT writing section is optional for test takers. **Please note:** the writing section is required by the University of California (UC) and many private colleges, and is not required by California State Universities(CSU).

The SAT Subject Tests are one-hour, mostly multiple-choice tests that measure how much students know about a particular academic subject and how well they can apply that knowledge. Students take the SAT Subject Tests to demonstrate to colleges their mastery of specific subjects like English, History and Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, and World Languages. It is recommended that Subject Tests be taken at the completion of a particular course or series of courses related to the subject area. (Subject Tests are recommended by some UC's and required by some private colleges in addition to the SAT or ACT.).

SAT registration can be completed online at www.collegeboard.org (credit card required).

SAT Fees for the 2017-2018 School Year

- SAT Exam (no Writing): \$46
- SAT Exam with Writing: \$60
- SAT Subject Tests: \$26 for the first test; \$21 for each additional test (maximum of three may be taken on one test date.)
- Fee Waivers are available to juniors and seniors (limit 2) based on demonstrated financial need.

SAT and SAT Subject Tests **cannot** be completed on the same test date. Students wishing to complete both tests must register for two test dates.

American College Test (ACT)

The ACT is a test that measures educational development in English, Mathematics, Reading and Science reasoning. Students may register for one of two test options: the ACT or ACT Plus Writing which includes a 30-minute Writing Test. Check the ACT website for a list of institutions that recommend or require the results from the ACT Writing Test. Students register by using the online registration option at www.actstudent.org (credit card required).

ACT Fees for the 2017-2018 School Year

The ACT test fee for the 2017-2018 school year is \$39.50 (no writing) and \$56.50 (Plus Writing). Fee Waivers are available to juniors and seniors (limit 2) based on demonstrated financial need.

WOLFPACK ATHLETICS & P.E.

Cosumnes Oaks High School just completed another outstanding year on and off the field of competition. Wolfpack athletic programs continue to improve each year as our school grows. In 2016-2017, the Wolfpack competed in the Capital Valley Conference which includes Roseville, Antelope, Whitney, Del Campo, Oakmont, Ponderosa and Bella Vista High Schools. The CVC is considered the toughest athletic league in Division 2 for the Sac-Joaquin Section.

Last fall, both Football and Women's Volleyball qualified for the CIF Sac Joaquin Section Playoffs. In addition, it was the first time in school history that our Women's Volleyball Team qualified for the Playoffs. Football qualified for Round II of the CIF Sac Joaquin Section Playoffs after defeating Davis High School 28-25. Cross Country continued its success by sending Wolfpack athletes to the Section Meet for the 9th consecutive year. Moreover, another first for COHS Athletics, Rosemary David, a member of our Women's Cross Country Team, was the first female in school history to qualify for the CIF State Cross Country Meet. Women's Golf finished 4th in the CVC and Women's Tennis had a successful season, finishing 4th place in the CVC. Fall sports will be an exciting time due to our determined athletes and committed coaches. The pack is on the hunt for league titles.

Winter sports proved to be very competitive this past year and the Wolfpack enjoyed a very successful Winter Athletic Season. Women's Basketball, Men's Basketball, Women's Soccer and Men's Soccer all qualified for the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Playoffs. In addition, our Men's Soccer Team won the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Division II Championship by defeating Gregori 2-0. Also, RJ Moorhouse, a member of our Men's Varsity Soccer Team, was voted The Most Valuable Player, for the Capital Valley Conference. Wrestling was very competitive throughout CVC matches during the season. Whitney Crawford, a member of our Wrestling Team, was a League Champion, in her weight class, and she became the first female wrestler in COHS history to qualify for the CIF State Wrestling Meet. Caleb Taper, also a member of our Wrestling Team, was also a League Champion in his weight class and qualified for the CIF Master's Meet. Wolfpack Cheerleaders led with spirit and provided high energy performances during Football and Basketball games; their energy is greatly appreciated by the coaches, players, and fans.

The spring was very successful in 2017 led by our Track and Field Team. Our Men's 4x400 Relay Team currently has posted the fastest time in the Section at 3:19.90. The team includes Curtis Witcher, Devin Bright, Pierre Scott and Julian Johnson-Millan. Another milestone was reached this Spring, when our Men's Tennis team qualified for the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Playoffs. Also, Jason and Patrick Wall, members of our Men's Tennis Team, won the League Championship for Individual Doubles. Wolfpack Softball finished 5th, in a very competitive Capital Valley Conference. For the 8th consecutive year, swimming competed weekly, and they had the 2nd largest athlete participation for spring sports. Wolfpack Baseball continued to improve throughout the course of the season. Men's Golf had a very successful season finishing 4th in the CVC. Finally, Men's Volleyball had impressive wins in league and non-league matches.

The Male Athlete of the Year was RJ Moorhouse and The Female Athlete of the Year was Kelsey Hill. The United States Army Scholar Athlete Award winners were Jeffrey Dresser and Nicole Terry. Finally, the United States Marines Distinguished Athlete Award winners were Caleb Taper and Abreanna Lake.

The Wolfpack reputation is one of competitive nature and pursuing victory with honor. The COHS athletic program supports over 1100 student athletes who represent our school and community with great pride and respect.

FALL ATHLETIC CLEARANCE

Fall Athletic Clearance will be held on July 25, 26, 27 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the Student Activities Room (HC-6). Parents and/or Athletes can pick up clearance packets in the front office. The first day of Football is July 31; all other Fall Sports begin August 7th.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION INFORMATION

All students are required to dress in P.E. appropriate clothing, either a Cosumnes Oaks High School P.E. uniform or plain navy shorts with a plain gray top. P.E. students will also need a combination lock (available for purchase through our Student Store). Students dress for P.E. the second day of school.

P.E. clothes will be available for sale for freshmen after *Welcome to the Den* (Freshmen Orientation) on August 4, 2017, beginning at 12:00 p.m. in the Multi-Purpose Room. In addition, P.E. gear is available for purchase through the Student Store on regular school days.

Ninth grade students are required to take the Fitnessgram Physical Fitness Test. There are six components to the Fitnessgram; students MUST pass 5 out of 6 components. Any 9th grade student who does not pass the Fitnessgram will be retested in 10th grade. If a student is unable to pass during sophomore year, the student is required to take an additional year of P.E. during their junior year.

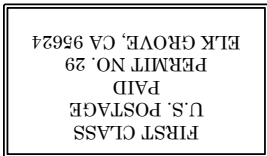
